Grand Lodge has sent out dues notices for 2025 of \$262

We have set up a Venmo account on our website so that you may pay your dues directly to Heartland Lodge, this will save you a fee. You may go online to the Heartland 576 website, click on the link and Pay your dues via Venmo, "Bryan Meyer-88", without paying a fee, or on iMember 2.0 and pay your dues with a credit card via Grand Lodge. There is a fee using the Grand Lodge site.

Go to Grand Lodge website (http://imember .freemason.org/ users/sign in) Click on sign in, Check membership status, Enter your E-mail Address. Or Your member ID number (which can be found on your dues card or above your name on your issue of California Freemason Magazine), which can be used to sign for the first time.. Enter a password, confirm password, complete form. Go to IMember 2.0 and log in. Use the dashboard to select the different sections/ this will put you into your personal data file. You will be able to change your information only. You will not be able change anyone else's information. There will be certain reports that you may view but not change. The new program has no provision for printing batches of dues cards. Dues cards will not mailed. You will be able to print out your dues card by accessing iMember 2.0. Also by selecting the tab for virtual dues card, this Grand Lodge app can be downloaded to a smart phone for a "virtual dues card" when visiting other lodges. This app has a 5 minute window to show the Tiler. Call us if you need assistance to log-in. Be Sure to check our website every month the calendar and updates, also special events. The secretary's email has changed. It is now

Logic (the last of the trivium) is the study of how to use reason to determine if a conclusion is true or false, as well as the study of the rules and tests of sound reasoning. It's also the study of the laws of thought or correct reasoning. Logic uses given information to create an inference. There are two main types of logic: formal and informal. Formal logic is the formal study of logic, and is often taught in math, philosophy, and computer science.

Learning logic can help you develop critical thinking skills, which can be applied to many areas of life, such as Identifying truth: You'll learn to distinguish truth from falsehood in arguments, speeches, news articles, and more. Making good decisions: Logical thinking can help you avoid mistakes when making important decisions. Communicating effectively: You'll learn how to craft compelling arguments in speech and writing. Analyzing situations: You'll be able to better understand the causes of problems and develop solutions. Foster teamwork: Logic-based results can help create a team environment where emotions and egos don't influence outcomes. Protecting yourself from deception: Logic can help you spot weak arguments and fallacies. And you can apply logic to many fields: Logic is foundational to many fields, including mathematics, computer science, and philosophy. It can also be useful in business communications, product management, business intelligence, project management, and business analysis. The benefits of honing your skills in logic are endless.

St. John the Evangelist



The two patron saints of Freemasonry as you should know, are the Holy Saints John. Which are Saint John the Baptist and Saint John the Evangelist. The feast day of the latter, St. John the Evangelist is on December 27th. Mostly celebrated by Christians, it has also been celebrated by Masons dating back to the 18th century when the Feast Day was used for the installation of Grand Masters.

Who is St. John the Evangelist? Within Christendom, he is also identified as John the Apostle, John of Patmos and John the Presbyter and is considered the author of the Gospel of John, the Epistles of John and the book of Revelation. Christian tradition says that John, Peter and James the Just were the three pillars (sound familiar?) of the Jerusalem church after Jesus' death.

Masonic scholars claim that the one reason why he is one of our Patron Saints, came from the practice of new Masons taking their obligations on a Bible opened to the first chapter of the Gospel of John. The "John" who was the supposed author of that gospel was, of course, John the Evangelist.

On December 27th 1717, the first, official Grand Lodge of Freemasons was formed in London, England, known as the Premier Grand Lodge of England. It was later unified with the Antients Grand Lodge in 1813 to become the United Grand Lodge of England.
